- **MOAR** is taking a leadership role in The Good Samaritan Campaign, by coordinating testimony and policymaker education for proposals to grant limited immunity from drug possession charges and prosecution when a drug-related overdose victim or a witness to an overdose seeks medical attention. The intent is to reduce drug-related overdose deaths by removing barriers to calling 911.
- **MOAR** as a MA Campaign for Addiction Prevention, Treatment, and Recovery member with MHSACM, MA Coalition for Addiction Services, and others educated policymakers to repeal the sales tax exemption on alcohol purchased in stores. At least \$20 million from the tax is to be used for services. We will continue to support the goal of a Substance Abuse Health Protection Fund, as well as protect services in this economic downturn.
- **MOAR** participated in, and will continue to participate in The Commonwealth CORI Coalition and MA Bar Association Drug Policy Task Force supporting Criminal Justice Reform.
- **MOAR** is building its AREAS –Addiction Recovery Education Access Services—Peer Facilitation Project to help people in recovery and their families navigate the system, as in Housing, Education, Telling your Story and MOAR! Interested? Skill Building Intro—November 16th—Call MOAR, 617-423-6627.
- **MOAR** with The Roxbury JP NoDrugs Coalition is facilitating an overdose prevention project to help persons in Boston prisons, return to the community.
